


PEACE DECLARATION REACHED AT A MEETING OF RELIGIOUS AND ETHNIC/COMMUNITY LEADERS WITH SECURITY AGENCIES HELD AT THE DIALOGUE, RECONCILIATION AND PEACE (DREP) CENTRE, KWANG, JOS SOUTH ON THURSDAY 22ND JANUARY, 2015

Arising from a dialogue and consultative meeting of Religious and Ethnic/Community leaders with Security Agents, held on Thursday, 22nd January 2015, Religious and Community leaders. We the Security Agents make the following peace commitment as it relates to the forth coming general elections in Plateau State:


1. We all pledge our support for a free, fair and credible election where everybody's vote shall count.
2. We resolve to conduct ourselves professionally before, during and after the general elections.
3. We pledge to accord equal respect to political Parties and Aspirants contesting the 2015 General Elections.
4. We shall not allow ourselves to be manipulated by any political party or aspirants during the General Elections or be seen to favour one aspirant or political party against the others.
5. We shall through effective surveillance and monitoring do our best to guarantee the safety of law abiding citizens, voters and Electoral Officers during the General Elections.
6. We the security agents pledge to collaborate among ourselves to ensure free, fair and peaceful General Elections. We therefore call on all religious and community leaders, women and youths to assist security agencies by providing information report timely any ugly situation or breach to the peaceful conduct of the elections to security agents.
7. We also call on all electorates to vacate the pooling units as soon as they cast their votes.
