



















PEACE DECLARATION REACHED AT A MEETING OF RELIGIOUS AND ETHNIC/COMMUNITY LEADERS WITH YOUTHS AND SECURITY AGENCIES HELD AT THE DIALOGUE, RECONCILIATION AND PEACE (DREP) CENTRE, KWANG, JOS SOUTH ON THURSDAY 22ND JANUARY, 2015

Rising from a dialogue and consultative meeting of Religious and Ethnic/Community leaders with youth leaders within and around Jos, held on Thursday, 22nd January 2015, Religious and Community leaders as well as Youth leaders make the following peace declaration as it relates to the forth coming general elections in Plateau State:

1. We all pledge our support for a free, fair and credible election where everybody's vote shall count. We humbly request the security agents and INEC Officials should be guided by transparency, honesty and fairness.
2. We resolve to conduct ourselves peacefully before, during and after the general elections.
3. That every aspect of our electioneering campaign will be devoid of any and every form of aggression, insult and hate speeches targeted at any political party or aspirant.
4. We shall show respect to political Parties and Aspirants contesting the 2015 general elections.
5. We shall call on our fellow youths to conduct themselves peacefully and shun any kind of activity capable of causing violence before, during and after the general elections.
6. That in an event where we disagree with the outcome of the election, we shall not resort to violent confrontation but seek legal means of addressing our grievances.
